- Facilitating ACT Art Club which allows for children and youth to see possibility in materials in everyday environments including nature and providing them opportunities to experience materials by awakening curiosity and offering different materials that are not offered in other curriculums.
- Inspiring creative thinking and open-ended arts-based experiences, working side by side with children, educators, and families.
- Planning, preparing, and facilitating the weekly program sessions, as well as ensuring the general safety, development, growth, and skill achievement of children in our community.
