- Provide children's mental health services within the scope of practice appropriate to the role for children aged 6 11 and families.
- Deliver work to individuals, groups, or families, tailoring your approach to meet the unique needs of each client.
- Work a schedule that includes evenings and weekends and may change as the program and community's needs change.

Prior to employment the successful candidate will have:

- An ECE, CYC, CYW diploma or degree or equivalent from an accredited institute.
- A minimum of 3 years professional experience working with children with behavioural challenges.
- Proficiency with MS Office Suite and video conferencing systems such as Zoom, Webex, and Microsoft Teams.
- Standard First aid/CPR C from a WSIB approved training partner
- Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Screen dated within 6 months
- Dated Immunization records for MMR, DTP, Polio and 1 step TB test
